#### **Opening Discussion**

# **Excursus: Woodcuts in the Small Catechism**

You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks. (Small Catechism)

# Excursus: The Fragility of Life | Our Desire for Control

Life was very fragile in Luther's day.

-Everything that happened had a supernatural cause

-Human desire to have control over one's life -Pursuit of controlling the supernatural -Book of curses to discourage thievery -Beggar's curse

How fragile is life today?

-What are ways we pursue some sort of control over the supernatural – the divine?

-Especially in light of biblical examples, how does Luther address the topic of 'swearing' (taking oaths)?

#### Excursus: A sinful world is a sinful world.

*"This is clear even now. The world is worse than it has ever been, and there is no government, no obedience, no loyalty, no faith, but only daring, unbridled people" [I. 69].* 

-Does it sound like Luther is speaking of today?

-I think this view of Luther's world is helpful in the face of talk that the world is getting worse.

-The world is just as sinful as it has always been.

-Tempers nostalgia

-But do not downplay the great tragedy and evil that we witness and experience today.

# ¶71-77

•God's holy name must not be wielded about wantonly.

•God's holy name must always be in our mouths.

-How do you navigate the distinction?

-Ballplayer who crosses himself before coming to the plate

- -Using God like as a 911 god (Moralistic Therapeutic Deism) vs. the Psalms?
- -In prayer, faith trusts, "If it be your will."

-Faith cannot force God like an incantation.

-"God be praised" [I.74].

-In ¶69 Luther says the God's wrath and punishment are displayed through the face of how terrible the world is. How can he make this move?

-First clear dig at monasticism (¶74)
